#### Notes for Exhibitors on Plant Names and Classification

Exhibitors should read the schedule carefully. Some classes require plants of different **species** and other classes call for different **genera**.

The genus (plural genera) of a plant is indicated by the first part of its botanical name. The species is indicated by the second part of the name. Where a class calls for more than 1 plant it is intended that these be of different species. If you have a plant which does not appear to fit within the categories below, please contact the Show secretory or refer to Shows Handbook as there are many plants that are not usually considered succulents that are eligible for entry and can be included in the Other Succulent classes.

The genera in the Mammillaria Society section have been subdivided and are not listed in the Shows handbook, although the groups Coryphantha, Mammillaria, Thelocactus and Turbinicarpus will be adhered to. If you are not sure which class your plant belongs to please contact the Shows secretary.

Please note that space in the venue is limited so the Show Secretary may ask entrants to limit the number of entries, most likely by limiting the number of entries by everyone to one per class. You will be contacted between entry closing date and show date if this is the case.

#### **SHOW RULES**

- 1) Eligibility Only members of the BCSS may compete but you do not need to be associated with the Sheffield Branch. Mammillaria Society Members who are not BCSS members can only enter the Mammillaria Society section.
- 2) Entry Forms Complete entry forms must reach the Shows Secretary no later than Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> May 2024
- **3) Awards -** Certificates, Diplomas and the Ron Ginns medal will be awarded on the day of the Show. Certificates will be awarded in place of the Sheffield Branch trophies.
- **4) Authority -** The nomenclature and classification of Cacti and Other Succulents will be as stated in 'The Handbook of Shows' 11th edition, 2021. This shall be the sole authority for judging throughout the Show. The judging of Class 3, 4 and 34 will be in accordance with note 7.4.2. Here the main emphasis is on the flowers, their number, attractiveness and colour,

though the general condition of the plant should not be disregarded. The Mammillaria Society subgroupings are determined by the Show secretary.

- **5) Conditions of Entry -** Entry in the Show shall constitute acceptance of all the Show rules.
- **6) Acceptance of Entry -** The Branch Committee reserves the right in exceptional circumstances to refuse any entry without giving a reason.
- **7) Novice Entries -** Only members who have **not** previously gained a first prize in any previous BCSS Show are eligible to enter.
- 8) Staging Exhibits may be staged on Friday afternoon, 31<sup>st</sup> May, between 5pm. and 7pm, or on Saturday morning from 8:30 am. All staging must be completed by 10:00 am on the Saturday. Please contact the Show Secretary if you would like to stage outside of these hours. The Show Stewards under the direction of the Shows Secretary, will supervise the staging of all exhibits. Stewards reserve the right to re-position classes and plants at their discretion. The Botanical Gardens may not open until 10am on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> June so if you wish to stage at this time and the main entrance on Thompson Road is locked please contact us and we will let you in. Please do not remove your exhibits before 14:00 on Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> June at the earliest.
- **9) Alterations To Exhibits** no exhibit, once staged, may be removed or altered in any way until the close of the Show, except by permission of the Show Stewards.
- **10) Pots -** the word **'pot'** shall be interpreted in all cases to include **Pans**. Only one plant shall occupy a pot.

Circular Pots: the size of a circular pot is the diameter measured at the top, inside the rim.

Square Pots: the size of a square pot is the length measured along one side at the top, inside the rim. This measurement shall be taken to be equivalent to the diameter of a circular pot.

Note: manufacturers' sizes marked or moulded on pots may not be accurate. The size of the pot for Show purposes will be taken to be the actual measurement as defined above.

**11) Judging** - all persons, including exhibitors who are not required for official duties are asked as a matter of courtesy, to stay well clear of the area where judging is taking place.

- **12) Liability** Whilst every care will be taken to protect exhibited plants, no responsibility can be accepted by the Society or Branch for any loss or damage, however caused. The BCSS carries an insurance policy covering Branch Shows for accident liability to persons only.
- **13) Pointing** 1st prize = 3 points, 2nd prize = 2 points and 3rd place = 1 point. When a competitor wins more than 1 prize in a class, only the highest points shall count. If a tie occurs for the most points in either of the two sections, two silver certificates shall be awarded.
- **14) Objections** any protests regarding the judging must be made to the Shows Secretary in writing within one hour of the completion of judging or of the Show opening whichever is the later. If the objection is found to be justified, the Class will immediately be re-judged.
- **15) Clearing** clearing of exhibits will commence at 4:00pm on Sunday 2nd June 2024. Exhibitors (or their representative) must be present at this time to remove their plants. All exhibits and other goods must be removed by 6pm at the latest on that day.
